## Spotlight on Space on WETA TV 26/HD

**Space Men: American Experience** airs Tuesday, March 1 at 9 p.m.

**A Year in Space** airs Wednesday, March 2 at 8 p.m.

**NOVA: First Man on the Moon** airs March 2 at 9 p.m.

In early March, WETA presents several productions spotlighting America's forays into space. *Space Men: American Experience* (March 1) introduces the Air Force scientists and pilots whose Project Manhigh — which collected data about the biological and technical factors required to support human activity in space — laid the groundwork for the U.S. space program. These pioneers would include the first Americans to venture into the atmosphere on the edge of our world, testing the limits of human physiology and ingenuity in that realm. With a fraction of NASA's budget and none of its renown, the Air Force efforts included experiments with rocket sleds and g-force, high-altitude balloon ascents, and parachute jumps (including those by Capt. Joseph W. Kittinger, Jr., above) from record-setting heights. *Space Men* is written and directed by Insignia Films' Amanda Pollak and produced by Pollak and Stephen Ives (who collaborated with WETA on the series *The West*), with Buddy Squires (a WETA partner at Florentine Films) as director of photography. Among other films from Pollak and Ives are the WETA co-production *Reporting America at War* and an array of history programs for *American Experience*.

Airing the next night, March 2, is *A Year in Space*, the first installment of a two-part PBS/*Time* series adapted from *Time*'s digital video series about astronaut Scott Kelly, whose current 12-month stay on the International Space Station is testing human limits for space travel and laying the groundwork for a manned mission to Mars. The program, timed to air within a day of Kelly's planned return to Earth, tracks the astronaut's mission from launch to landing as NASA charts the effects of long-duration spaceflight by comparing him to his identical twin on Earth, astronaut Mark Kelly. Also on March 2, WETA reprises both *NOVA: First Man on the Moon*, a portrait of Neil Armstrong that explores the astronaut's achievements and recounts his heroic risk-taking and humble dedication to advancing humanity's adventure in space, and *Phoenix Mars Mission: Ashes to Ice*, which spotlights a lander mission to the "Red Planet."

# In the Spotlight

## Martyrs, Mayhem & Martial Law: Life in Civil War Alexandria

**The new WETA production airs Wednesday,  
March 9 at 8 p.m. on WETA TV 26/HD**

**A** new WETA film, following up on the 2014 WETA production *Discovering Alexandria: The Early Years*, spotlights more of the extraordinary history of Alexandria, Virginia — this time focusing on the Civil War years, 1861-1865. With engaging imagery and the insights of local historians and experts, the one-hour documentary *Martyrs, Mayhem & Martial Law: Life in Civil War Alexandria* explores a host of topics, such as the Union occupation and what it meant for the southern city; the militarization of city resources, port, railroads and industry; the city's role in the defense of Washington; and more. Illuminating engaging human stories of the community, the program explores the city as a den of espionage; what life was like under martial law for residents; the war's impact on the African-American community and the former slaves who came to the city to live and work; and the many ways that the influx of tens of thousands of soldiers transformed the area. The program also spotlights the many historic buildings in the city that were commandeered to aid war wounded and converted to medical facilities, including the Mansion House Hospital that provided the backdrop of the recent PBS drama *Mercy Street*, set in Alexandria.

The film is the culmination of research conducted at the Alexandria Library and other city resources, as well as the Library of Congress and the National Archives, and features Jim Mackay of The Lyceum; Audrey Davis of the Alexandria Black History Museum; Susan Hellman of Carlyle House Historic Park; Susan Cumbe of the Fort Ward Museum; and J. Lance Mallamo of the Office of Historic Alexandria. Tune in to *Martyrs, Mayhem & Martial Law: Life in Civil War Alexandria* on March 9 and note that the WETA film repeats weekend afternoons on March 12, 13 and 19, and in primetime on Wednesday, March 16 at 10 p.m. on WETA TV 26 and WETA HD.

## New seasons of *Grantchester* & *Mr. Selfridge* begin on *Masterpiece*

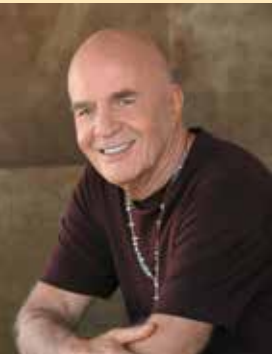
**Sunday, March 27 at 9 p.m. & 10 p.m. on WETA TV 26/HD**

**T**une in on March 27 at 9 p.m. for the beginning of new seasons of popular *Masterpiece* dramas *Grantchester* and *Mr. Selfridge*. The *Masterpiece* Mystery! series *Grantchester*, Season 2 features James Norton (*War and Peace*) reprising his role as Reverend Sidney Chambers, the whiskey-drinking, jazz-loving vicar-turned-sleuth who pursues investigations and spiritual nourishment in a quiet country parish near Cambridge in 1950s England. Robson Green returns as Inspector Geordie Keating, the rumpled, veteran cop who befriended and aided Chambers in Season One. The series starts a six-week season that ends May 1.

At 10 p.m. on March 27, in a two-hour *Masterpiece* presentation, *Mr. Selfridge*, Season 4 commences its final season, which runs nine weeks through May 22. The series stars Jeremy Piven (*Entourage*) as Harry Gordon Selfridge, London's colorful but troubled early 20th-century retail king, who provided shoppers with the ultimate experience at his department store, Selfridge & Co. The new season of the *Masterpiece* drama picks up the story in 1946, charting the fate of the showman with the big heart, shaky morals and dogged belief that the dice roll will save him and the store every time — as he faces creditors, swindlers, mob bosses, irate relatives and spurned mistresses.

Funding for *Masterpiece* is provided by Viking River Cruises and Audible with additional support from public television viewers and contributors to The Masterpiece Trust.

Hosted by the Smothers Brothers Tom and Dick, and Judy Collins, the celebration of 1960s folk-rock features an array of classic acts such as the Kingston Trio, the Brothers Four (above), Glenn Yarbrough, the Highwaymen, the Limelites, Randy Sparks and the Minstrels, Roger McGwin, and John Sebastian. The program features musical offerings including "Tom Dooley," "Michael, Row the Boat Ashore," "Baby the Rain Must Fall," "Turn, Turn, Turn," and many more. *This Land Is Your Land* presents a musical journey through the evolution of modern American folk music, from its roots in bluegrass to coffeehouse and club success to its popularization nationwide.



Also this month, the *My Music* series presents the new program *Favorite Love Songs*, hosted by Emmy Award-winning actress Susan Lucci (*All My Children*). ## 50 Years with Peter, Paul and Mary

**Sunday, March 13 at 7 p.m. on WETA TV 26/HD**

**50** *Years with Peter, Paul and Mary*, a 2014 documentary by four-time Emmy Award-winning producer/director Jim Brown, spotlights the popular folk music trio's career, featuring rare and previously unseen television footage — including a BBC program from the early 1960s that embodies many of the group's best performances and most popular songs. This is Peter, Paul and Mary at the peak of their success, a time when the influential trio dominated the *Billboard* music charts. From the group's emergence in Greenwich Village, to the Civil Rights and anti-war era of the 1960s, through the decades of their later advocacy and music, to Mary Travers' moving memorial, and finally to the present — where their legacy continues to inform and inspire successive generations — this intimate film reveals the impact of the group's artistry and activism. The program features a host of songs, including "Five Hundred Miles," "If I Had a Hammer (The Hammer Song)," "Blowin' in the Wind," "Stewball," "Leaving on a Jet Plane," and other classics.

**S**ince its inception in August 2007, the Celtic Thunder vocal ensemble has thrilled audiences with its crisp harmonies and powerful world music numbers, bringing a signature twist to an eclectic mix of songs while introducing music from the group's homeland and traversing with ease the genres of folk, traditional Irish, adult contemporary, rock, and classical crossover. 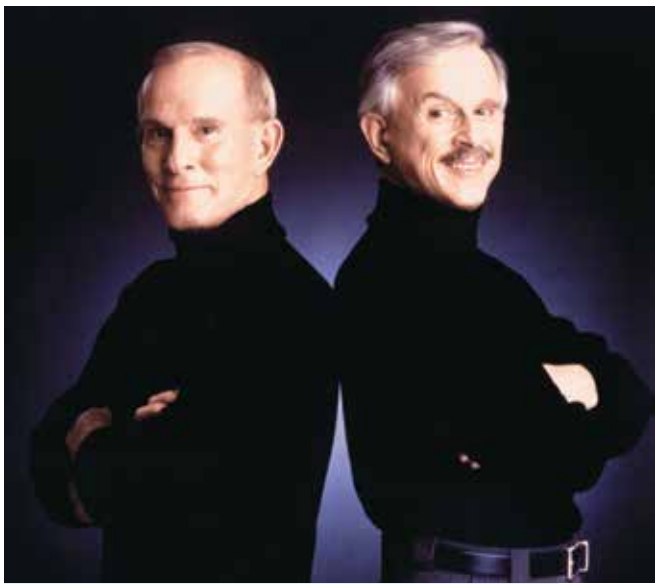

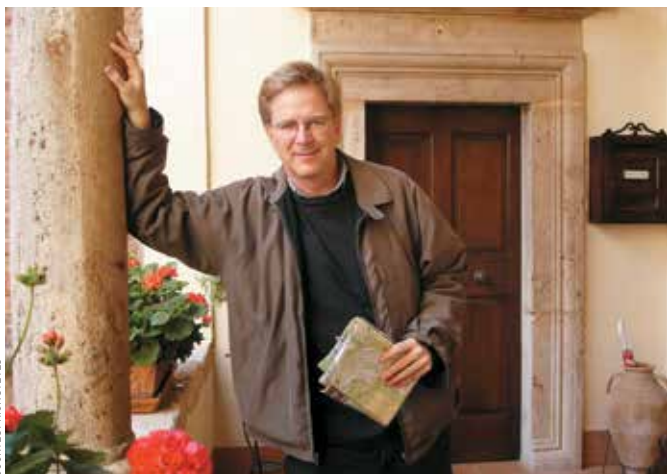

## DCI Banks, Season 3

Thursdays, March 3, 10 & 17 at 10 p.m. on WETA UK

**S**tephen Tompkinson (*Ballykissangel*) returns as Yorkshire Detective Chief Inspector Alan Banks in three gripping 90-minute crime stories based on novels by Peter Robinson. Andrea Lowe portrays Banks' colleague DS Annie Cabbot, newly returned from leave — is it time for Banks to admit how he feels about her or will their work prevent the two from ever getting together? Also starring is Caroline Catz (*Doc Martin*) as DI Helen Morton. In the first episode, a man and woman claiming to be social workers abduct a child and DCI Banks is quickly drawn into a search for the missing boy. In the second episode, an investigative journalist is found dead in a holiday chalet in a remote village and Banks and his team must sort through an overwhelming number of leads. And in the third story, a chain of events is set in motion by the discovery of a gun in a young girl's bedroom, ultimately putting Banks' own daughter in danger and sparking an internal investigation that threatens to break up Banks' team.

## Lilies

Saturdays at 8 p.m. starting March 19 on WETA UK

**L**ilies, an eight-part 2007 BBC series from Heidi Thomas, the creator of *Call the Midwife* and the recent *Upstairs, Downstairs*, presents a coming-of-age story that spotlights three sisters learning to rely on one another as they make their way in a harsh, post-World War I world on the brink of change. Depicting the realities of life in 1920s Britain through humor, heartbreak and the spirit of hope, the series follows the Moss sisters — “my lilies,” as their father calls them — who live in working-class Liverpool. Catherine Tyldesley (*Coronation Street*) stars as Iris, the eldest of the three, who dutifully runs the household in the wake of their mother's death; wayward May (Leanne Rowe, *Oliver Twist*) works as a maid but longs to perform onstage; and youngest daughter Ruby (Kerrie Hayes) sells corsets and trains to swim at the Olympics. Alongside their sorrowful, overbearing father (Brian McCardie, *Line of Duty*) and war-tormented brother (Daniel Rigby, *Flyboys*), the three young women struggle through poverty, passions and disappointments — sustained by the fortifying power of family.

## Shetland, Series I & II

Thursdays at 10 p.m. starting March 24 on WETA UK

**T**he BBC crime drama *Shetland* stars Douglas Henshall (*Primeval*, *Collision*) as Detective Inspector Jimmy Perez, who investigates cases in Scotland's Shetland Islands archipelago. As the drama opens, the native Shetlander has recently returned to the islands with his 14-year-old step-daughter, Cassie. The stories are based on novels by British crime writer Ann Cleeves, whose Vera Stanhope novels are dramatized as the television detective series *Vera* on WETA UK. The first *Shetland* series, which premiered in the U.K. in 2013, is a two-part story based on the Cleeves novel *Red Bones*. In the opening case, an elderly islander is found murdered on an archaeological site at her small farm, and Perez and his team must find the killer. Series I airs on March 24, 10 p.m.-midnight. Series II, based on Cleeves' novels *Raven Black*, *Dead Water* and *Blue Lightning*, begins the following week.

## Musical Travels on the March NSO Showcase

This month's NSO *Showcase* broadcast is especially rich and varied: we'll enjoy a musical journey to Spain and Italy as well as two virtuoso concertos, all in a program that features five different conductors! All the music was recorded at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

In the first stop on our musical travels, Osmo Vänskä leads the National Symphony Orchestra in Mendelssohn's sunny *Italian Symphony*. Mendelssohn was a gifted artist, and his painter's eye shines through this masterpiece composed during his Grand Tour. Slovakian conductor Juraj Valcuha leads the orchestra and Norwegian soloist Vilde Frang in Max Bruch's *Violin Concerto No. 1*, a work so beloved that Max Bruch grew to resent its popularity. "I cannot listen to this Concerto any more," he would tell aspiring violinists, "go away, and play the other two Concertos!"

Ravel's euphoniously-titled *Pavane pour une infante défunte* was also very popular, especially among piano-playing young ladies. Ravel said he wanted to evoke Spain in the Golden Age and "the *pavane* that might have been danced by such a little princess as painted by Velázquez." Ludovic Morlot conducts the NSO in the orchestral version of this much-loved masterpiece.

Once Franz Liszt finally settled down in Weimar after years of touring as a virtuoso pianist, he was able to focus on finishing his *Piano Concerto No. 1*. In the process he developed an entirely new concerto form. British conductor Sir Mark Elder leads the NSO and soloist Stephen Hough in this performance from 2014.

We end our musical tour with Christoph Eschenbach conducting Debussy's *Îbéria*. Despite having spent just one day in Spain (popping over the border to see a bullfight), Debussy's imagination brings a village festival to life in all its vibrant color. Indeed with its excursions to Spain and Italy, and two Romantic solo concertos (not to mention five conductors (!), March's NSO *Showcase* is a feast for the senses. Join us Wednesday evening, March 2 at 9 p.m.

## Bach's *St. John Passion* on Choral Showcase

Sunday, March 20 at 9 p.m.

Although the *St. Matthew Passion* is the better-known of Bach's two surviving passions, the *St. John Passion* is a piece that many say is even more realistic than the *Matthew*, and that's in spite of the *St. John* coming about under less than ideal circumstances. Bach had just started as cantor of the four big Lutheran churches in Leipzig. In writing the *St. John*, he surely wanted to prove that he was the right man for the job. (He was not the first choice.)

Passion settings, by this time, had evolved to include the story (from Biblical text), plus comment and elaboration (from contemporary poetry). Within that framework, Bach created a dramatic work that grips your attention from first note to last. It is operatic in scope, and its storytelling method is modern. The work's perspectives—from the key players, from the bystanders commenting on the action in reflective arias, and from the group chorales using hymns—make for pacing and shifting points-of-view

that we describe today as theatrical excellence.

The *St. John Passion* was easily Bach's biggest work to date; he didn't hold back, and he believed he had plenty of room for everyone at St. Thomas's, the largest church in his charge. When he was told that the performance was to instead be in (the smaller) St. Nicholas's, he insisted that his musicians be given more space. Bach's poignant writing for the viola da gamba and violas d'amore will (alone) convince you that his standing firm was wise.

On the March 20 broadcast of *Choral Showcase*, we've scheduled the *St. John Passion* from last year's performance at Washington National Cathedral. Handel's *Messiah* follows on March 27. We also salute Choral Arts, who perform Mahler's *8th Symphony* with the Philadelphia Orchestra this month at the Kimmel Center. On March 6, we've scheduled the recording conducted by Valery Gergiev which features the Choral Arts Society of Washington.



## Bach and More on Front Row Washington

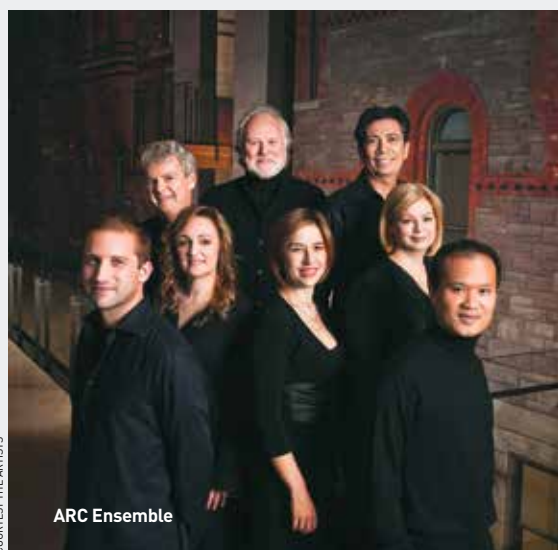

**H**ear the name Glenn Gould, and the phrase “world-famous pianist” springs to mind. But did you know he made his 1955 American debut right here in Washington at the Phillips Collection? To celebrate its 75th anniversary of presenting Sunday concerts, the Phillips Collection offered a re-creation of Gould’s iconic recital featuring another Toronto-born pianist and composer, Stewart Goodyear. On January 10, 2016, Mr. Goodyear positioned himself at the Phillips’ Steinway piano and delivered what the *The Washington Post*’s Anne Midgette called “an exhilarating hour and a quarter of music that he made entirely his own.”

*Front Row Washington* happily celebrates this re-creation of Glenn Gould’s historic recital on Johann Sebastian Bach’s birthday on Monday, March 21 at 9 p.m. Don’t miss Stewart Goodyear’s masterful interpretation of works by Beethoven, Sweelinck, Webern, Berg and Bach as history is brought to life in the Phillips’ intimate music room.

We begin the month’s *Front Row Washington* broadcasts on Monday, March 7 with an all-Russian program from Chamber Music at the Barns at Wolf Trap featuring the Atos Trio, one of BBC Radio 3’s “New Generations Artists” and recipient of the K-L-R International Trio Award. Their program includes trios by Rachmaninoff, Shostakovich and Anton Arensky, as well as three folk dances by the Soviet “Jewish School” composer, Alexander Wepruk.

Jewish classical masterworks written just before the Nazi rise to power in 1933 compose our March 14 program. We remember Erich Wolfgang Korngold for his great Hollywood film scores, but in the 1920s he was as popular an opera composer as Richard Strauss. The ARC Ensemble from Toronto’s Royal Conservatory performs Korngold’s *Suite for 2 Violins, Cello and Piano (Left Hand)*, commissioned by the wealthy Austrian Paul Wittgenstein, a distinguished pianist who lost his right arm to a battlefield amputation. Like Korngold, the Italian-Jewish composer Mario Castelnuovo Tedesco migrated to Los Angeles, writing over 130 film scores. He called his 1931 piano quintet “my best chamber work,” a piece the ARC Ensemble performs on their Pro Musica Hebraica concert from the Kennedy Center Terrace Theater. In all, a varied and vibrant March of recitals you won’t want to miss, Monday nights at 9 p.m. on *Front Row Washington*.
